Black and white photography has a timeless appeal, and in many cases, it can touch viewers in a more profound way. Some landscape photographers may find it difficult to work without color. In the first half of this program, Huibo will discuss developing and finding one’s own vision by sharing her own evolution towards personal, expressive black and white landscape photography; then in the second half of the program she will discuss several compositional and tonal control techniques (including her postprocessing flow) to improve our vision of seeing and editing in black and white.



Huibo is a landscape photographer based in San Diego, California. She fell in love with photography about 25 years ago as a hobbyist while working in the wireless communications industry. Then life got in the way and Huibo had to set aside her photography pursuit for quite some time. In early 2015 she rekindled her love for photography and gradually became more serious about the craft. Landscape photography, especially in black and white, is the artistic medium that Huibo is passionate about. Huibo says, “It serves as my creative outlet to express how I observe, interpret, and connect with nature.”
